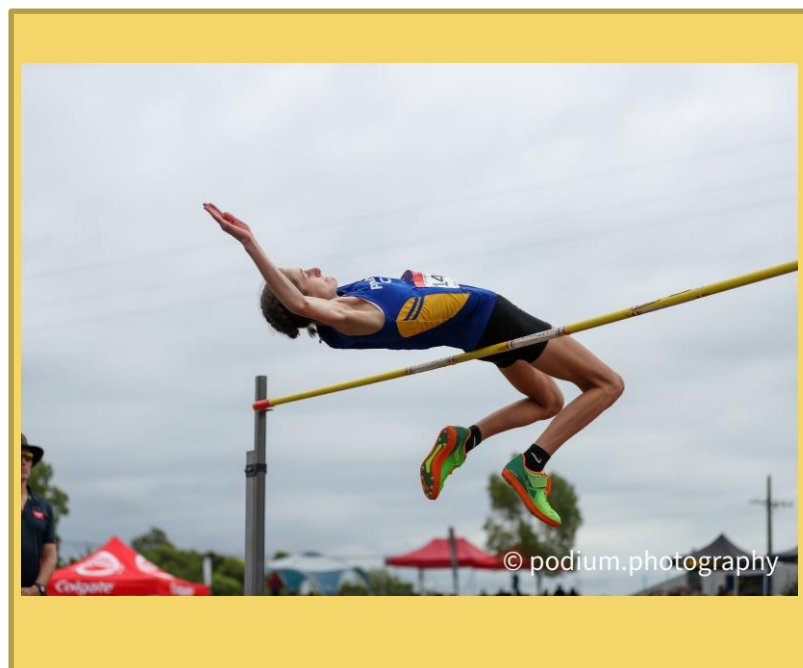

I am pleased to present the annual report as Papanui Toc H President for the 2022/23 year. This season saw athletics life returned to pre covid conditions and even though our numbers were ever so slightly down the club looks to have tracked well as the sport tries to recover after the challenges of the last few years.

Membership

Club nights and Interclub meetings have resumed as normal, and we have seen a small increase to our junior section this season, however we have also seen a small drop off in our 15 - 19 teenage group. There seems to be more work needed to promote the transition from junior to afternoon senior athletics, this is obviously important to keep the both the senior club thriving and keep our athletes in the sport.



Coaching

We continue to have a very strong contingent of coaches in the club supporting senior squads and junior coaching sessions. This year the junior Thursday coaching session reached capacity and thanks must go to Grant Knaggs for managing these sessions each week with his team of capable and enthusiastic coaches.

Administration and Track updates

This will be my final year involved with coaching and the committee but I know I leave the club in good hands. The committee continues to work on a track replacement program but there are a few challenges with how best to remove the current surface and the unknown

cost of how to best future proof the current base with regards to drainage, runoff, and ongoing maintenance. This is a complex and costly project which will only be possible with a large funding grant. If any member has any expertise, they could lend to this important venture please make contact with one of the committee members.

Finally, on behalf of myself and all members, I would like to thank our committee, officers and all the others who volunteer at the Club for all your work last year. Without your efforts the Club would not be able to operate, and your commitment is much appreciated. In particular, I would like to thank our Treasurer Mark O'Reilly, Secretary Erana Rattray and Junior Club Captain Sarah Hurring for their MANY hours of work keeping the Papanui Toc H family ticking along again this season. It has been a great pleasure working with you all over the past few years, and I wish you and the Club all the best going forward.

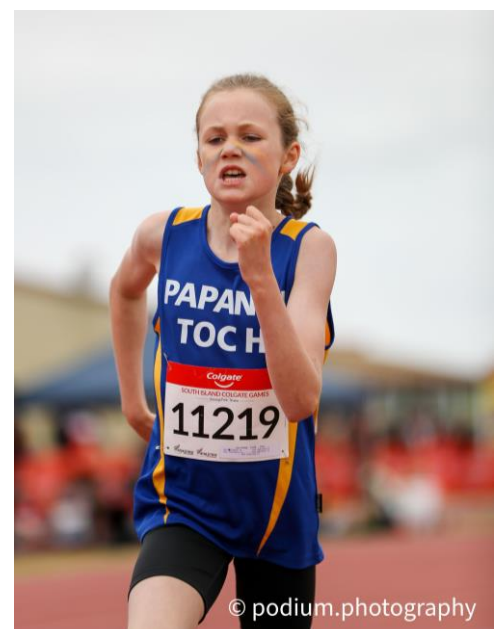
JUNIOR CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

The Junior club returned to its usual program with no Covid-related interruptions this season. One of the key highlights was our growing junior club membership numbers this year with 145 athletes in total, at a time when many other clubs had declining numbers. Our approach of offering a free trial club night continues to be welcomed by families and almost always converts into a season membership. We are strong across all girls' age groups but we do need to try and attract more boys as some of the age groups are quite lean. It is lovely to see new families joining and contributing to the club and joining the PTOC family of parents, supporters and coaches.

Colgate Games

A team of 60 athletes and their families and support crews enjoyed a wonderful weekend of athletics in Timaru. The weather was kind to us again and everyone came away proud of their efforts with a collection of flags, ribbons, personal bests and medals. Families caught the Colgate 'bug' and are already looking forward to next year.

The club won 4 golds (including 3 relay medals), 7 silvers and 5 bronze medals. Special mention to Ruan Tahi who won 4 individual medals (100, 200, 400, SP), Robbie Tahi with a double silver in the 100 and 200 and Jake Boyd a double silver in the Discus and Shot Put.



Saturday Interclub

A return of relays to the program allowed PTOC to show its strength in numbers across many of the age groups. The 12 year boys showed their class by breaking 3 Canterbury records - 4 x 100m relay (Jake Boyd, Ruan Tahi, Max Hurring, Robbie Tahi), Discus (Jake Boyd) and 60m (Ruan Tahi).

Canterbury Championships

A team of 59 athletes attended the 2-day championships with the blue and gold finishing of the season in grand fashion. We were the second club overall on points with 20 individual Canterbury Champions, 8 relay teams in the top 3 and 8 athletes top 3 age group winners.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The following Management Report summarises the Club's activities in an easy-to-read way. As per last year the accounts have not been audited as they are prepared by a Chartered Accountant.

Overall, there is an Operating Profit of \$4,833 compared to \$4,124 in the previous year.

Main points:

It was another solid year for the club, although the subscriptions were down due to a reduction in senior athlete numbers.

Not surprisingly insurance and power costs have increased over the past 12 months.

We continue to make a loss on the Winter Gym due to low attendance numbers. It is no longer viable for the Club to continue to run this session and it has been wound up.

The Junior Thursday coaching is covering its costs thanks to strong interest in this group of athletes.
