PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is my pleasure to again present the annual report as Papanui Toc H President for the 24/25 year. The club has continued to perform well and has seen a continuation of growth in our numbers, driven largely by the ongoing strength of the junior club.

Membership

It would be ideal to report otherwise, however, the transition from the junior to senior club remains a challenge. It was hoped that with new initiatives from central bodies, such as the inaugural hosting of a Launch Athletics event at Nga Puna Wai, more of our junior athletes would remain engaged in the sport under the support and guidance of well-known local senior athletes. We look forward to supporting further initiatives of our local and national athletics bodies to change the statistics in this area.



Coaching

We remain very fortunate to have an incredibly well respected and knowledgeable group of coaches supporting both our junior and senior squads. It is commendable and speaks to the values of our club, that they share their skills and support with athletes from all over the region (and beyond). A very sincere thank you to everyone who offers up their time to support our athletes, including those coordinating, we really would not have a club without you.

Administration and Track Updates

The number of volunteer hours that go into administration and planning for our club, to ensure all our members have a positive experience, would floor most people and certainly does not go unnoticed by myself and the wider committee. This year, in particular, this could not be more true.

We are unbelievably proud to have, this year, reopened the Buzz Jones All Weather Track, a project that has been long anticipated but always seemed slightly out of reach. No words will capture the sheer grit and determination that this has taken from the committee and other committed volunteers, a huge thanks goes out to each and every one of them. This is a facility that we are very privileged to have and we will be relying on all our members to protect this asset for the years to come. Please indulge me as I include the list of thank you's from the opening speech earlier this year:

Does anyone think they might know how much this cost to replace our track? Well, it was nearly \$400,000 which is an awful lot of money to raise which is why I am sure you'll all agree it is worth spending a few minutes thanking those people that have made this possible.

Before I begin the list of thank yous, I do acknowledge that I may inadvertently miss someone off the list. Please know that this is truly not intentional, we are so very grateful for absolutely everyone's support.

I would like to first start with the two gentlemen up here with me.

- Buzz, the name behind the Buzz Jones All Weather Track not only was he involved in the
 original track project but he continues to contribute to the club in too many ways to mention,
 including with this replacement (which by the way would have cost A LOT more if there
 wasn't a track here to begin with), writing to members past and present, running raffles,
 selling honey, donating prizes for quiz night and the raffles, the list goes on.
- Tim (Macioce)- without you this project simply would not have started! Tim was the one who came to me with the first lead for a possible grant application and he hasn't stopped since, creating and following up leads, chasing quotes, liaising with contractors and the school, attending meetings and finding solutions to roadblocks as we encountered them. I cannot even begin to explain how amazing it was to have someone like Tim in our corner through this.

These activities meant we could achieve the dream and since that time we have been very grateful to Nathan Tahi for his project management of the contractors (well beyond my expertise for sure!) and other families, including some already mentioned above, who have spent hours down here checking lines, further improving our facilities and looping in support from other services, such as ReadyMix who loaned them some equipment needed - a thank you goes to the Hurrings and Rattrays for this.

To Henry Blakely Landscaping, many thanks for committing to rental of the temporary fencing until we can implement a permanent solution to protect this amazing asset.

Papanui High School have been an amazing partner, allowing us the opportunities we have here, and we are very grateful for their support as we faced delays meaning this work was undertaken during term time.

To the committee, thank you for the support in believing that we could get there - an amazing bunch of volunteers who made this happen, especially Mark for keeping the finance side under control.

Athletes, if you look around you, you will see a whole bunch of people who worked incredibly hard to bring this to life - can anyone tell me how many of them do you think will ever use this track? The answer is likely, not a single one. How cool is that - these people have put all of this work in for YOU! If there is one thing that I'd love you to take away from this (besides of course treating the track with respect and preserving it for years to come), is that there truly is reward in doing things for others, not just for yourself. My family joined Papanui Toc H because of friendships and the family-oriented nature of the club. This track resurface project has reminded me of the values of our club and I hope you take this with you into the future.

Our work is not done, we still have some funds to raise to replenish the club funds, get a permanent fence and look at security options, as well as all of the other things we would like to invest in for you, no matter what events you love. Please get behind us, many hands make light work.

Please support the committee in their efforts as we strive for the finish line - raising the last funds needed for permanent fencing and security cameras to protect our investment.

This year the committee have also implemented new technology to track results and reduce the administrative burden along with other initiatives such as new uniform design. I cannot reinforce how lucky we are to have such a passionate and committed bunch of volunteer parents and coaches on the committee. We are always in need of more help, so if you fancy a supportive environment where you can make a difference, please consider joining.

JUNIOR CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

The junior section had another successful and enjoyable year. We welcomed many new athletes and their families to the PTOC community with 210 members. We all watched excitedly as the old track was removed and bit by bit the new track started appearing. This resulted in some disruption to club nights, but we adapted, knowing that this would be a short-term problem with a fabulous treat at the end. That came in the form of being able to hold our Club Championships on the brand-new track.

We are grateful to the club for investing in a new website manager and Club Manager program. This has allowed us to be more agile with website content with the ability to share results from club nights and display PBs to encourage and reward personal improvements. It has also aided the logistics of organising event sheets each club night and selecting relay teams.

Colgate Games

A small team of 8 athletes and their families started the new year at the North Island Colgate Games in Hastings. They came home with 5 medals and a relay medal in the Girls 13 grade with a composite team of 11 - 13 year olds.

With a hometown South Island Colgate Games we had a large team of 100 athletes who ran, jumped and threw their way around Nga Puna Wai. This was the first Colgate Games experience for many, and they enjoyed the chance to meet Olympians along the way such as Hamish Kerr. The medal tally was 52 individual medals including 24 gold along with 9 relay medals—the best performance of any club. As a result, Papanui Toc H was awarded the Jeanette Vivian trophy for the most successful Canterbury club.

Saturday Interclub

This year we had a record number of athletes registered to complete at Saturday Interclub events. Numbers are strong across all of the age groups other than the 7 year olds. It is important that we keep attracting new kids to the sport and our club. It was pleasing to see so many happy faces, friendships with other clubs and sportsmanship on display. There were many wonderful performances over the season including two new Canterbury

records for Lily Dunne in the 100m (12.48) and the 60m (8.07) with this record having stood since 1979! Our parents and families led the way with providing starts, officials and marshals for events which was noted by Canterbury Childrens and Athletics Canterbury.

Canterbury Championships

These were held a week earlier which shortened the season. This didn't stop our large team of 82 athletes performing to their best. There were numerous personal records, 27 Canterbury Champions and 52 additional top 3 placegetters. We had an impressive group of relay runners with 8 winning teams and 4 other teams placing 2nd or 3rd. This team effort resulted in Papanui Toc H winning the D Buchanan Trophy for Overall Relay Points for the second consecutive year. The season was topped off by the club being awarded the McKinstry Trophy for the top club at the Canterbury Champs - a feat not achieved for 10 years.

This year we had several Overall Age Group winners, showing how bright the future of our athletes is including a clean sweep in the girls 12.


SENIOR CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

An enthusiastic group of Senior Papanui TocH athletes competed with distinction during the road/harriers and summer track seasons. At 31 registrations, the numbers were comparable with recent years, with the 11 in the MU18 classification being close to the largest of the Athletics Canterbury non-Senior age groups.

As in previous years, a pleasing number of Club 13- and 14-years Juniors competed occasionally on Saturday afternoons during the track and field season. This experience has proven to be especially valuable in keeping young people involved in athletics after their Junior years.

Eleven Club athletes reached the podium in their events at the Athletics NZ championships in Dunedin, while an equally impressive number medalled at the South Island and National secondary schools' championships.

The line-up of Club-affiliated Senior coaches has grown during the past year, and are now able to offer training in all disciplines apart from javelin and hammer.



CROSS COUNTRY AND ROAD REPORT

This year we had a well organised team of parents managing the race entries and coordinating training sessions. We were once again very grateful to Graeme Christey for volunteering his time and expertise. This year he was ably supported by Craig Stephenson, especially on Sunday morning long runs - a staple for any cross-country runner. Trainings were well attended and it was great to see ongoing friendships among our junior runners.

FINANCIAL REPORT

The following Management Report summarises the Club's activities. As per last year the accounts have not been audited as they are prepared by a Chartered Accountant.

Overall, there is an Operating Profit Before Depreciation of \$7,645 compared to \$11,545 in the previous year. Main points:

It was another solid year for the club, subscriptions were strong, Strong junior numbers are driving the stability. Expenses were up slightly with the new website; we also spent some money on the Discus Circle and equipment.

The Club raised \$349,609 for the track replacement which cost \$400,119 with the balance coming out of club funds.

Balance Sheet remains stable & strong and we had sufficient cash in the bank at Balance Date and Still \$30,000 in term Savings.
