PRESIDENT'S REPORT

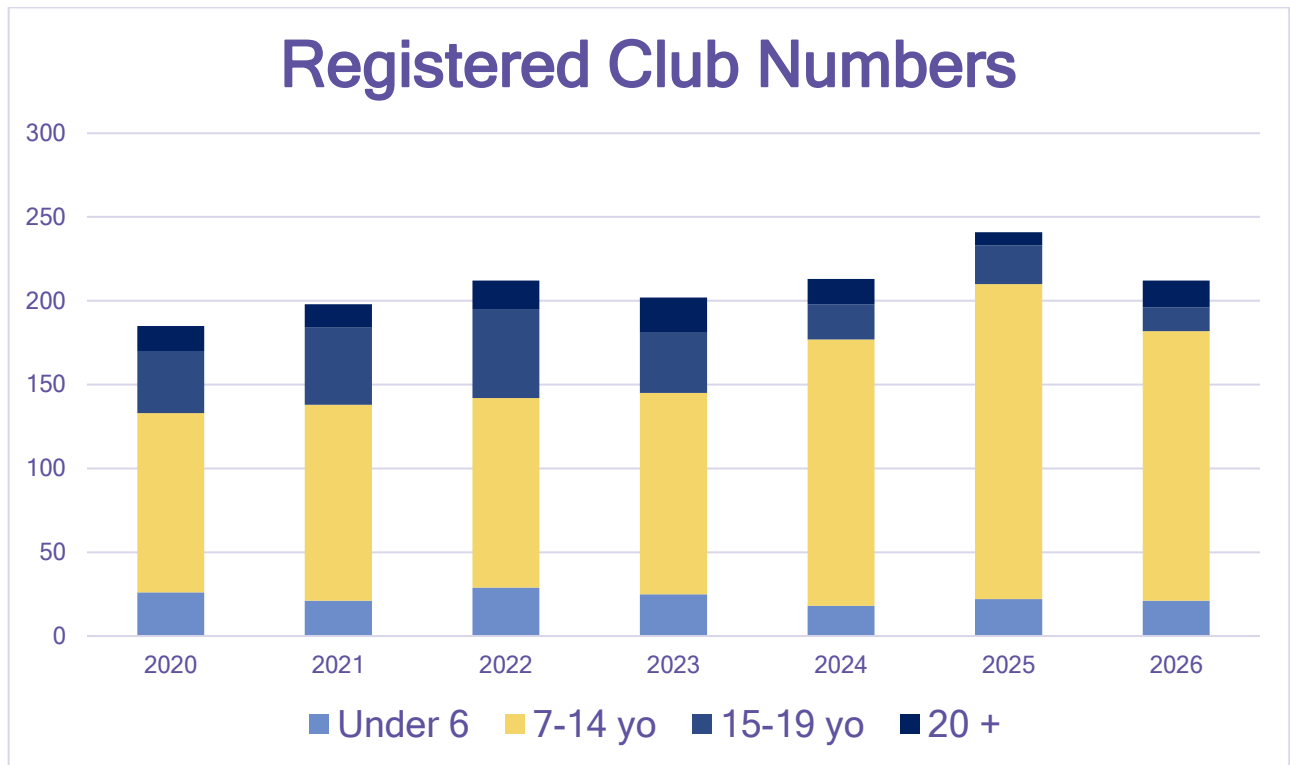
I am delighted to present my first President's report for a year that has seen a new chapter in the long history of the club with a number of exciting firsts. After the hard work of the previous year in installing the new track, the club was able to enjoy the first full season of this wonderful upgrade to our facilities. To be able to provide a first-rate running surface for our junior club night program and allow our senior athlete squads to be able to train alongside each other has set the club up well for the future.

In recognition of the need to protect this resource the club liaised with the school to install security cameras, advocated for bollards to be placed to prevent vehicles accessing the grounds from the Sawyers Road entrance and obtained a significant grant to fund a fence to be built along the north side of the track.

One of the most fun aspects of the year was to unveil a new uniform which was co-designed by the committee and Paladin who are providing us great service. The blue and gold certainly stands out on the track and trails, and we are proud to include the club logo on all the products. We have the ability to continue to grow the range of products if the membership support this.

Some key governance actions have been completed. The change to the Incorporated Society Act has required all clubs to update their constitution to meet the requirements of the new Act. Acknowledgement needs to be given to Athletics NZ who provided support to the clubs in the form of webinars, templates and a willingness to address questions about the process. Many thanks to the membership who attended a Special General meeting to approve this and allow us to register well before the cut-off date. The result is a constitution which is easier to read and more fit for purpose. The club has retained Charitable status, and our reporting requirements remain with the Charities Commission.

Athletics NZ have, quite rightly, been putting the spotlight on the importance of each club and centre having robust Safeguarding processes to protect our athletes, coaches and volunteers. We are fortunate to have the Centre Safeguarding officer based in our club and we have appointed a club safeguarding officer. We are committed to ensuring all coaches and those in key volunteer roles have completed the World Athletics Safeguarding online course.



Membership numbers show a small reduction in junior registrations but the total membership of 212 places us as the 3rd largest club in Canterbury. I believe that our club is in good strength and well placed to continue to grow. A large part of this is down to the hard work of our club captains and their assistants who present a welcoming approach to new and old members and a can-do attitude. This creates a supportive atmosphere and a nice balance between fostering participation and a love of athletics alongside supporting the competitive side of our club. On that note it is worth acknowledging that the club had nominations in the Athletics Canterbury awards across junior and senior sections, coaches and officials.

This report highlights the work of our small but passionate committee. Several members are standing down, providing opportunities for others to bring their skills and energy to the club. At the beginning of the year Les Rattray stepped down and has continued providing throws coaching to our junior group. At the AGM we have some long serving members standing down from their roles. Mark O'Reilly has provided a steady hand on the finances as our Treasurer and has managed some large sums through the books. Vanessa Buchan steered the track development and has continued to show her skill in grant applications. Ange Charlett has provided many years of navigating Gameday and responding to queries as our Registrations Officer. While not an official member of the current committee we must also thank Clare Hastings who has ably and efficiently manned the clubnight BBQ and fed many hungry athletes and parents at the end of a busy program.

With the main facility developments completed, our attention for the next season will focus on developing a club strategy to provide a focus for the next 5 years. The club is only as strong as its athletes, volunteers and supporters and I welcome input from the membership.

JUNIOR CLUB CAPTAINS REPORT

The junior section continued to flourish as the season progressed. Thanks to the new track, we were able to hold our Tuesday night sessions even in less-than-ideal weather, which was a huge advantage. It's wonderful to have such a high-quality facility available again. Many families remarked on how much their children enjoyed using the track. With large numbers in several year groups, we were also able to make full use of the second long jump pit and additional throwing circles, enhancing everyone's experience. Families could easily access athletes' Personal Bests throughout the season and individual athletes were presented with a certificate at Prizegiving. Thank you to the parents who entered results on a weekly basis. Athletes also enjoyed receiving "Athlete of the Week" Certificates at Tuesday training.

Colgate Games

A team of six athletes, along with their families, traveled to the North Island Games in Tauranga. The group achieved an impressive haul of five golds and one bronze. Among our under-10 athletes, three competitors earned four first-place pennants and one silver. A fantastic effort all around

Nelson was the venue for the South Island Colgate Games. We had 72 registered athletes, and we were the largest Club to compete. The medal tally was 36 individual medals including 9 Gold, 15 Silver and 12 Bronze. The relay teams gained 9 medals, including the Mixed 14 Medley Relay 1600m Gold. Two of our 14 Year old athletes Rocco North and Lucy Gredig were awarded with the Nick Willis Colgate Scholarships for the South Island. These scholarships are awarded for exceptional performance, sportsmanship and character.

Invercargill in January 2027 will be another great trip away for families.

Saturday Interclub

A strong contingent of athletes consistently participated in the Saturday Interclub events. Across the age groups, there were more boys than girls. The girls consistently had relay teams in most age groups, in the relay events throughout the season. Our athletes, supported by parents and dedicated supporters, consistently exhibited excellent sportsmanship, offering encouragement to all participants.

Over the season, athletes continued to improve and achieve personal bests and we had 12 athletes receive medals for the Quadrathon and Mini Quadrathons. Four Canterbury

Records were broken. Jonty Walker in the 800m (2:22.86s), Annabelle Smallman Discus (36.93m), Lucy Gredig 60m (8.02s) and Lily Dunne 800m (57.67s)

Canterbury Championships

The Children's Canterbury two-day event marked a strong finish to our season, with 63 athletes representing the club— a slight dip from last year, but still an impressive turnout. Our relay teams shone brightly, with 15 Papanui Toc H relay squads competing with pride and determination. Their efforts delivered 6 first-place finishes and 2 third placings, showcasing depth across the club.

Every single athlete achieved **at least one personal best**, reflecting the hard work and progress made throughout the season. The club was awarded the McKinstry Trophy for the club gaining the highest points at the champs for the second year running

Across all events, our athletes secured:

- **29 First places**
- **28 Runner-up finishes**
- **22 Third placings**

A commendable collective performance and a testament to the dedication of our athletes, coaches, and supporters. This year we had 11 Overall Canterbury Champ Winners

SENIOR CLUB CAPTAIN'S REPORT

At around 30 registrations, the numbers of Papanui ToCH senior athletes remained consistent with the past few seasons. A notable feature of the group was the 21-strong segment in the younger (U16/18/20) Senior age groups, many of whom performed spectacularly well at the Athletics NZ track and field championships in Auckland.

PTOC medalists at the champs were:

Lucy Gredig – gold, WU16 100m and 200m and a member of the winning Canterbury 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams; bronze, 400m

FINANCIAL REPORT

The following Management Report summarises the Club's activities. As per last year the accounts have not been audited as they are prepared by a Chartered Accountant.

Overall, there is an Operating Profit Before Depreciation of \$6,612 compared to \$7,646 in the previous year. Main points:

It was another solid year for the club, subscriptions and trading activities were on par. Expenses were up slightly with increased insurance to cover the new track.

Balance Sheet remains stable & strong. The bank account was very flush as at 31.3.26 because we received a grant of \$50,494 for the track fence which was unspent as at 31.3.26. Overall as I write this report and with the track, fence and security cameras all in place, we have \$8,600 in the bank plus \$25,143 in a savings account which is a pretty good position to be in.
